

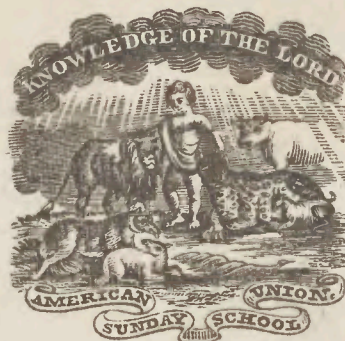

I. א The letter א aleph has four services:

1. It is called a mark, or characteristic א, because, when it comes before the radicals, at the beginning of verbs, it marks the first P. C. S. in the future tense, e. g. אֲרַעָה *ergneh*, I shall feed.

2. A paragoric א, which is found at the beginning, middle, and end of a word, e. g. אֶשְׁכַּר *eshcaur*, a gift, Ps. lxxii. 10: at the middle, we find נֶאֱשָׂר *naishaar*, Ez. ix. 8. instead of נִשָּׂר *nishar*, he was left, Dan. x. 8: and at the end, we say נָקִי with א, for נָקִי (without א,) innocent.

3. A quiescent א, being one of the letters of יהוה which is never pronounced either with or after these eight points, viz. kaumaitz, pau-thach, tzairai, segol, cheereek, cholaum, kib-bootz, and shooraik. And

4. A diminutive א, because it is wanting in the nouns and verbs, e. g. we find כס *kais*, Ezek. xvii. 6. instead of כסא *kisai*, a throne, Deut. xvii. 18. and מוחטו *maichato*, Gen. xx. 6. instead of מוחטא from sinning, 1 Sam. xii. 18.

II. The letter י yod has eight services, viz.

1. It is called a mark, or future י, and is found in all the tenses of the paradigms, and shows the 3 P. M. S. in the future tense.

But the probability is that as these were the first avalanches of any considerable magnitude or threatening aspect, which had happened there since the pass through the mountains had been discovered, and the road cut through, about seventy years since, he would have concluded to remain where he was; trusting that a similar event would never again occur.
