# How to Use the Spiritual Warfare Bible

he purpose of the *Spiritual Warfare Bible* is to provide the reader with opportunities to study the principles and teachings contained in either the New King James text of this Bible or the various additional teaching elements added by the publishers to become prepared and equipped to utilize the power and strength of the Holy Spirit to engage our enemy, Satan, and his demonic influences in spiritual warfare and to be victorious over them.

The additional teaching elements added are written in the present tense so that their impact will address the reader's life at the moment of studying the Word and teachings. The Scripture texts used in the additional teachings use, for the most part, the New King James Version of the Bible.

While the inclusive pronoun *us* is often used to involve the reader, the pronoun *you* is used whenever possible so as to confront and engage the reader with the impact of the teaching.

The introductions to each book serve to highlight and give an overview of how the Holy Spirit teaches the believer the principles necessary to be equipped and prepared to engage in spiritual warfare. It is not the purpose of the introductions to give a comprehensive outline or overview of the content of that book. When a particular book has no specific texts referring to the work of spiritual warfare, a more general introduction is given to identify how God's Spirit was moving through the life of that author or during that time in history.

Spiritual warfare teachings may be found throughout this Bible to give further insight, inspiration, and depth from the perspectives of outstanding Christian pastors and authors.

#### **ADDITIONAL STUDY ELEMENTS**

There are six different tools in the *Spiritual Warfare Bible* for your personal study and devotions. Here is a list of the tools and how to use them.

#### Spiritual Warfare Declarations

There are more than two hundred fifty Spiritual Warfare Declarations to be found within the text of this Bible. These are presented as one-sentence, Scripturebased prayers or declarations that affirm the reader's determination to confront the enemy in spiritual warfare with the assurance of the Holy Spirit's preparation and help. These declarations include a Scripture reference showing the Bible verse that is the basis for that declaration. You may:

- Choose a declaration as your declaration for each day.
- Read progressively from Genesis through Revelation, reading the declarations as you read the Bible text in your daily time of study and devotions. As you read, pause to reflect on the truth of each declaration.
- Choose to commit one declaration to memory each day.

#### Spiritual Warfare Basics

There are nearly 220 Spiritual Warfare Basics, and several will be included with each book of the Bible. They are usually one-half to one column in length. These are short, succinct tips for doing spiritual warfare. They are topically chosen for the Scripture verse or verses near where they are positioned within the text. They cover many of the very basic things you will need to know as you prepare to engage in spiritual warfare.

Some ways to use these Spiritual Warfare Basics include:

- 1 Read a Spiritual Warfare Basic each day for a daily devotional time.
- 2 Read progressively from Genesis through Revelation, completing one Spiritual Warfare Basic each day, and then apply the revelation to your daily life.
- 3 Keep a journal of your insights and responses to these and the other study elements in this Bible. The journal can serve as your personal training manual for spiritual warfare.

#### Lessons From God's Warriors profiles

There are twenty-one character profiles of Old and New Testament persons who were equipped and anointed by the Spirit for engaging the enemy in spiritual warfare. Each profile shows how the Spirit enabled that person for a specific endeavor in warfare. The profiles could easily be adapted for a three-week small group study about spiritual warfare or as part of a specific devotional plan for three weeks. Be sure to journal your responses as you read about each character, and include your

# Putting Spiritual Discernment Back Into Spiritual Warfare

ow that you are prepared to begin incorporating the material in this *Spiritual Warfare Bible* into your daily spiritual development and understand more thoroughly how important it is to be prepared to stand strong against the enemy's aggressive attacks against the people of God, it will be important for you to remember that spiritual warfare is just one element of living the Christian life. You must recognize the need to remain balanced in your faith, always growing in your intimate spiritual relationship with the Lord, demonstrating the power of the Holy Spirit in your life through the fruit of the Spirit in full expression in your daily walk, growing in your expression of the spiritual gifting that God has for His children, and still being prepared to enter spiritual warfare against your aggressive enemy, Satan. The following important article will help you to remember the need for balance in spiritual warfare as you study this Bible.

I was raised in spiritual warfare. By that I mean, soon after I got saved I plugged into an apostolic church that vowed to run to the battle lines to wrestle spirits of Jezebel, witchcraft, religion—and whatever else was opposing the purposes of God.

My church home was akin to a spiritual war zone. We were always on red alert through prophetic warnings, dreams, and visions about the next attack. Indeed, spiritual warfare was a consistent thread in most of the praise, worship, equipping classes, Sunday morning sermons, and leadership lessons.

I was in a spiritual warfare ditch where the enemy and his plans were ultimately exalted over God and His plans. Don't get me wrong. I believe wholeheartedly in spiritual warfare. But if we take any spiritual principle to the extreme, we can get into a spiritual ditch. So we have to guard ourselves from deception by adding balance and soberness of mind to our vigilance. Our enemy is roaming around like a lion seeking someone to seize upon and devour—and getting out of balance opens a door wide enough for him to freely enter (1 Pet. 5:8).

Another prophetic key is exercising the gift of discernment. Why not step back and pray about the root of the matter? When you do, you'll be more successful in battling what's battling you because you open the door wide enough for Holy Ghost wisdom to freely enter. It may be that you need to repent for something you are doing that's allowing the devil to manifest in your midst. Or it could be that an enemy you've never fought before is attacking you—and you need true spiritual discernment to identify the attacker.

Then again it could be possible that you are in a completely different ditch. Maybe you aren't going on the offense against the devil at all. The problem is that God won't do our part for us. He's given us authority in this earth realm. Jesus gave us His authority, as well as keys to the kingdom. Whatever we bind on earth is bound in heaven. And whatever we loose on earth is loosed in heaven (Matt. 16:19). In other words, we can't blame God when the devil gets in. We're the ones who allow it.

Again, I started out in an extreme spiritual warfare ditch, where even worship music was an exercise in combat. Yet having escaped a church where strife ruled and reigned—and in which Jezebel was typically blamed for most of the rumblings in the congregation—I entered into a prophetic church that took an opposite approach. And I entered another spiritual warfare ditch.

During my extended season at this prophetic church I never heard them bind Jezebel once. I never heard anyone come against witchcraft or rebuke the spirit of religion. All they did was praise and worship the Lord for hours on end and roll around on the floor and laugh. This was unusual for me, perhaps especially so after exiting the extreme apostolic. I enjoyed it—until I realized I was in another ditch.

Yes, our praise and worship in the midst of the battle confuses the enemy and shows our faith in God's deliverance. But God is not going to do our part. Although I agree that the battle is the Lord's and we can praise Him knowing He's fighting on our behalf, we still have to be prepared to exercise our God-given authority. David was a worshiper, but he was also a warrior. He knew when to draw a sword, and he knew when to draw praise from his lips unto God.

After living in both extremes, I have learned a lesson: we must all become skilled warriors and intimate worshipers. In doing so, we avoid either ditch of extremism and walk in the discernment of the Holy Ghost, knowing when to run to the battle line and when to worship.

When you go to war, go with the right strategy. Sometimes that means prophetic worship. Other times it is spiritual warfare. Many times it's a combination of both. Ultimately, Jesus must be the center of our focus. "The LORD is a man of war; the LORD is His name" (Ex. 15:3). And He is worthy to be praised.\*

## INDUCTION INTO THE ARMY OF GOD

o *be inducted* means to be formally installed or put into a position or office. As you read this Bible and study the materials about spiritual warfare that accompany it, I pray that if you have not been inducted into the army of the Lord, you will make the decision to do so.

The materials are not deep. They are basic training tools for those who desire to understand the foundational principles of warfare. Many in the body of Christ want to be promoted in the area of spiritual warfare, but they have not taken the time to prepare themselves. They have not met the specifications of the prerequisites. God is calling a muster alert for those in the household of faith to take a radical position against the wiles of the devil. In the military, when a muster alert is called, no one except the highest-ranking officials know if the alert is for training or real war. The motto of the natural army is to be "combat ready." In other words, every time a training exercise or alert is called, soldiers must be ready to respond as if it is a real war.

God is calling His church to a "real war" mentality. Many Christians haphazardly quote, "The weapons of our warfare are not carnal," but fail to walk in the reality of "real war." As a result, people who love God become weary in well doing and acquire a "rolling with the punches" mentality. They are not prepared to deal with the obstacles of life because they have taken everything as it came. They have no basic or advance training in the things of God to teach them how to confront their enemies in victory. My prayer is that this Bible will give you a foundation to be prepared for twenty-first-century warfare.

In their warfare today, the natural army is not using catapults and bows and arrows as weapons. This was all right for warfare in centuries past. But today the army uses nuclear weapons. I agree that there is nothing new under the sun, but new truths are being released to the church for today's warfare. These things have been around all the time, but they are new to us. Do not be afraid of what is new to you. Allow the revelations here to put a demand on your spirit to go to the next level. You cannot continue to use weapons of times past against twenty-first-century darkness.

Some of the information in this Bible may seem too radical to you if you are in a comfort zone. If this is the case, I prophesy you out of

your comfort zone by the Spirit of the Most High God. I challenge you to plunge into the deeper things of God. I realize that not everyone is called to be a frontline soldier, but I dare you to do the basics that are required of all born-again believers. Mark 16:17–18 is our basic training guideline for every believer. The scripture reads:

And these signs will follow those who believe: In My name they will cast out demons; they will speak with new tongues; they will take up serpents; and if they drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover.

Always remember that Mark 16:17–18 gives basic foundational instruction for *the everyday believer*!

This passage says that believers must recover. In the Greek, the word *recover* in this passage of Scripture is *ana nephoh*, which means, "to become sober again, to regain one's senses, to recover self." How many people of God have taken arrows from the enemy and have never recovered? David received his marching orders from the Lord and recovered all!

Timothy asked, "How can a bishop take care of the church if he does not have rule in his own home?" (See 1 Timothy 3:5.) This brings one question to my mind. How can we, as the church, win the world if we have no rule in the house of God? I believe this Bible contains keys to releasing the power of God in our own homes and in the church. The key to praying for our churches, communities, and cities is allowing the untapped power of God to flow fluently through us as everyday believers.

The revelations in this Bible are not limited to those called to the office of the intercessor. If you have been blood bought and are tired of the devil having his way in your affairs, God wants to sign you up for His special forces! When we accept Jesus into our lives, we are automatically signed up for the army of the Lord. Many do not realize it, but they are in the army of the Lord whether they accept it or not. We are not just members in the church, but we are soldiers for the Lord. Every born-again believer is called to do warfare.

God is taking us past "the right hand of fellowship" (Gal. 2:9), and He is teaching our hands to do war! I want to touch your spirit and agree with you that God would flood your heart with revelation through the contents of this Bible. By this flood you will have a better understanding of the hope of your calling. Remember, though we walk in the flesh, our warfare is not after the flesh.

After I signed up with the military, there was a grace period before I actually began active duty. Many people make commitments to God but never show up for active duty. The benefits that are afforded to a soldier cannot be received until he or she receives active duty military status. What is your status as God's soldier? Have you sworn in but failed to

become active in the things of God? Allow the content of this Bible to activate you, so that in the end you will not stand before the Chief Commander of Creation with your work left undone.

Pray this prayer of agreement with me:


Father God, in the name of Jesus, I bind every whispering spirit and strange voice that is set against my spiritual warfare training. I take authority over the spirits of imagery and magnification, and I declare that the eyes of my understanding are opened. Mind binders and blinders are blocked and forever bound. I also bind the spirits of slothfulness, slumber, and demonic inertia from causing me to be sleepy when I am reading this Bible. Every distraction is under my feet, and all spirits of doubt have no open place. It is my purpose to tap into the unadulterated truth of God's Word. I am open to new levels of spiritual warfare in my life. Spirits that would prompt "the fear of the unknown" are locked out of my mind. I am not afraid! New boldness is my portion! My spirit is open to agree with the revelations in this book that bear witness with the Holy Spirit. I renounce all religious and familiar spirits that may have influence on the way I receive.

Holy Spirit, I give You permission to deprogram my thinking about anything that has limited the greater works of Jesus Christ in my life. I commit to walk in the anointing of the end-time believer. All lies and strongholds that have built walls against the truth in my life are pulled down, in Jesus' name. The scales and veils are removed from my eyes so that my understanding will not be hindered.

Lord, I thank You that the words here will sharpen my sword and give weight to my realm of influence in the Spirit. This spiritual influence will affect every area of my life and leave an imprint on everything that I put my hands to the plow to do. This spiritual influence will also anoint my steps whereby my footprints will release a centrifugal force in the earth that will confirm the dominion of Christ in my life. I commit to the truth and believe that in every area of my life I will be made free. This liberty will permeate my loins and reproduce freedom in the lives of others. I sign up to be activated for the army of the Lord."

# INTRODUCTION The Holy Spirit Prepares and Empowers Us for Spiritual Warfare

# The Holy Spirit's Work in MARK

n many ways the books of Mark, Luke, and John parallel the teachings in Matthew. All four books are accounts of Jesus' life on earth, His death at Calvary, and His resurrection to heaven.

In two specific instances Mark highlights aspects of the supernatural work of the Holy Spirit through Jesus. Each of these teaches us about the preparation and equipping of believers to do the works of Christ and to be effective in defeating Satan.

Mark 5:25–34 vividly illustrates the value of human touch as a point of contact for faith—that is, as an aid to believing. The experience of the woman who was afflicted with a chronic hemorrhage also provides several other keys for the one who seeks healing.

First, she heard about Jesus and thought of Him as the one to help her in her desperate need. Second, she actually came to Him, overcoming her embarrassment and fear of the crowd. Third, she kept affirming her faith by saying to herself, "If only I may touch His clothes, I shall be made well" (v. 28), thereby releasing her faith, and she was miraculously healed.

There is no essential difference, as far as the flow of Christ's healing virtue or power is concerned, between individuals' touching Him and His touching them. Christians may lay hands on the sick in the name of Jesus to enable them to believe more easily (Mark 16:18).

Mark 16:14–20 is the only passage in the four Gospels where Jesus mentioned speaking in tongues. In verses 17–18 the risen Lord clearly promised that signs would accompany those who believed as a result of Christians going into all the world down through the centuries and preaching the gospel to all creation. Miracles were meant to confirm the ministries of God's servants in every generation.

These "signs following" were to be the credentials of the ambassador of Christ and characteristic marks of God's people under the new covenant.\*

## BASICS The Kingdom of God

Over time the true meaning of the kingdom of God has been overshadowed by the religious conventions of Christianity, church denominations, and the traditions of man, thereby hindering believers from *true* freedom. Let us take some time to truly understand what God really intended by this phenomenon called *the kingdom*.

The kingdom of God is a literal, spiritual realm accessible only to born-again believers. This realm encompasses the power and resources essential to the believer if he or she desires to achieve the manifestation of heaven on earth. (See Genesis 2:4–5.) It can be best understood from an analogous perspective of the natural cosmological systems of the universe.

In the kingdom of heaven the believer's earthly experience is filled with the essence of the righteousness that is God. It is a spiritual realm in which believers are privileged to exist and function at prosperous levels while physically living in the earth. This life is lived with the perspective originally intended by God at the forefront—that is, fulfilling God's original mandate to humanity as presented in Genesis 1:28—that we are to have dominion on the earth.\*

# LESSONS FROM GOD'S WARRIORS THREE BIBLICAL GENTILES

Learn to Hunger for More of God

Jesus said, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be filled" (Matt. 5:6). Hungry people are desperate people. They will push over the custom; they will push over the ritual—they don't want to leave hungry. Jesus found such hunger while visiting Tyre and Sidon. A woman whose daughter was possessed and tormented by a devil heard that He was there. But the woman was Greek, "a Syro-Phoenician by birth" (Mark 7:26), and, therefore, outside of the covenant God had made with Israel. But that didn't matter to her. She was hungry, and her faith was persistent. Even when Jesus discouraged her, saying that the "bread" was first for the children of Israel, she was hungry enough to ask for even a crumb that would fall to the floor. Many of the children who sat at the table had not shown such great hunger. Jesus honored her request, and her daughter was healed because of her persistence (vv. 29–30).

Hungry people are hungry for more of God than they have ever had. They are breaking out of religious rules and traditional thinking and breaking through to more of His presence, more of His power to turn situations around, and more of His healing and miracle-working power! Only Jesus satisfies that hunger!

It was such hunger that was stirred in the heart of a Gentile centurion in Caesarea who fasted, prayed to God always, and gave generously to the poor. Though they were Gentiles, Cornelius and his household devoutly feared and served God. As Cornelius was fasting and praying one day, an angel appeared to him with a message. The angel said, "Your prayers and your alms have come up for a memorial before God" (Acts 10:4). And then the angel instructed him to send for Peter, who was nearby in Joppa. Peter, who was fasting at the time as well, saw a vision from God in which many foods that were unlawful for Jews to eat were presented to him. He was still puzzled by the vision when Cornelius's messengers arrived. Going with them to his house the next day and hearing of the hunger in this man's heart, Peter understood that the vision meant that the gospel was not to be withheld from the Gentiles. As he shared the gospel with those of Cornelius's household, the Holy Spirit fell and baptized them all, and later they were baptized in water. (See Acts 10.)

Fasting stirs a hunger in your spirit that goes deeper than the temporary hunger you experience in your flesh. When you hunger for God, He will fill you. Jesus went through cities where He could do no miracles—because there was no hunger. As Jesus entered Capernaum, He was confronted by a Roman centurion whose servant was paralyzed and tormented (Matt. 8:5–13). But the centurion knew it would take only a word from Jesus for the servant to be healed. When he said those words to Jesus, the Bible says Jesus was amazed at his faith and told those around him, "I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel!" (v. 10). He was saying, "So many in Abraham's lineage don't have the hunger this man has shown. They come to see Me, but they don't hunger."

In this day God is saying, "I'm looking for somebody who wants something. I'm looking for somebody who will do more than show up but will hunger for that which I want to place in him!"\*

#### Satan Tempts Jesus

### MANIFESTING SIGNS AND WONDERS Read Mark 16

In Mark 16 Jesus promised that those who believe in Him would be empowered to do many signs and wonders, including casting out demons, speaking in new languages or tongues, and laying their hands on the sick for healing.

After the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, Jesus' promise became a reality as witnessed throughout Acts. Luke reported that "the apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders," which included healing the sick casting out demons through the power of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:43; 5:12–16; 8:4–8; 13:9–12).

Signs and wonders follow those who believe. How can that be? Believers are filled with the power of the Holy Spirit and operate in the gifts of the Spirit. As they minister the gifts, God performs miracles according to His sovereign will. God wills that people be saved, delivered from demons, healed of diseases and hurt, and protected from every attack of the evil one. Signs and wonders demonstrate Jesus' power to the unsaved and encourages believers in their faith.

#### Jesus Is Questioned About Fasting

from Galilee followed Him, and from Judea <sup>8</sup>and Jerusalem and Idumea and beyond the Jordan; and those from Tyre and Sidon, a great multitude, when they heard how amany things He was doing, came to Him. #### A House Divided Cannot Stand

<sup>20</sup>Then the multitude came together again, <sup>a</sup>so that they could not so much as eat bread. <sup>21</sup>But when His <sup>a</sup>own people heard *about this*, they went out to lay hold of Him, <sup>b</sup>for they said, "He is out of His mind."

## Symptoms of Demonic Operation

The subject of mental illness is very controversial in Christian circles. Inside the extreme schools of thought we find balance and a scriptural viewpoint. First, let me say clearly, all mental illness is not the result of demonic attack. Further, good psychological care from Christian professionals is vital and in order when an individual is struggling. Also, professionally administered medication may be necessary when chemical imbalances occur. When normal medicine and therapy do not result in a cure, then it is possible that these symptoms could point to demonic operation.

Let me list for you fourteen symptoms of demonic operation. As these symptoms are listed, realize that some of them could also be caused by something other than demonic oppression. The first six symptoms on this list are extreme and are drawn from the account of the demoniac of Gadara in Mark 5. This man had been chained in a cemetery because of his erratic and violent behavior. When you look at Mark 5:1–15, you can see clear symptoms of demonic activity.

#### Symptom 1: Incapacity for normal living (Mark 5:1–5)

Just as the actions of Legion made him unsuitable for normal social interaction with friends and family, an unusual desire for solitude, accompanied by a deep loneliness, will often set in. The person will often become very passive with no desire to change.

#### Symptom 2: Extreme behavior (Mark 5:4)

Violence will often be evident in the victim's life. An explosive temper and extreme, uncontrollable anger are dangerous behaviors that control the individual and the people who love him or her.

#### Symptom 3: Personality changes (Mark 5:9, 12)

Multiple personalities exist in some of the most serious cases of demonic control. This man had a "legion" of spirits within his life. All cases of multiple personality may not be demonic, but in most cases demon activity is involved. Changes in personality, extreme or mild, may be evidence of demonic activity.

#### Symptom 4: Restlessness and insomnia (Mark 5:5)

In verse 5 we see this man crying in the tombs "night and day." He could not sleep. Insomnia can be a sign of a physical problem or a sign of a spiritual problem. God has gifted His children with sleep (Ps. 127:2). So when you cannot sleep night after night and there is no medical reason for this disturbance, the devil may be tormenting you. Don't forget; you have the right to rest in Jesus! David said in Psalm 4:8, "I will both lie down in peace, and sleep; for You alone, O LORD, make me dwell in safety." Sleep is God's gift to all who trust in Him.

#### Symptom 5: A terrible inner anguish (Mark 5:5)

The man at Gadara was deeply tormented in mind and heart. Various levels of anguish are evident in those who are afflicted by demons. Grief and anguish are normal emotions for us all. Yet persistent, unresolved anguish that will not leave after normal therapies of counseling, encouragement, and prayer could well be demonic.

#### Symptom 6: Self-inflicted injury and suicide (Mark 5:5)

Here we see the demonic man was cutting himself. If you read Mark 9:14–29, you will see the story of the man whose son was both deaf and mute because of a demon: "Wherever he [the evil spirit] seizes him, he throws him down....Often he [the demon] has thrown him [the boy] both into the fire and into the water to destroy him" (vv. 18, 22). Jesus cast out the demon. "The spirit cried out, convulsed him greatly, and came out of him. And he became as one dead....But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he arose" (vv. 26–27). Demons can cause people to injure themselves. They even incite suicide.

#### Symptom 7: Unexplained illness with no obvious medical cause

When medical testing produces no physical cause for an illness, then we should look to the mind and spirit for answers. Sometimes illnesses are psy-chological, and good counseling can result in a cure. Other times the battle is with demons. There are physical illnesses caused by a class of demons known as "spirits of infirmity."

#### Symptom 8: Addictive behavior

Addiction to alcohol, drugs, sex, food, gambling, and other things opens the door to demonic influence and control. I am not saying demons cause all of these problems; certainly people are responsible for their own wrong choices. But anything that causes one to be out of control opens that person to infernal control.

#### Symptom 9: Abnormal sexual behavior

When Jezebel's son inquired about peace, Jehu responded, "What peace, as long as the harlotries of your mother Jezebel and her witchcraft are so many?" (2 Kin. 9:22).

In Ezekiel 16:20–51 the spirit of harlotry is mentioned several times. This spirit infected the nation of Israel with the sins of Sodom (vv. 49–50). They even sacrificed their own children (vv. 20–21). Homosexuality, adultery, fornication, and even infanticide are all inspired by the spirit of harlotry. Hosea 4:12 says, "The spirit of harlotry has caused them to stray, and they have played the harlot against their God." Look at Hosea 5:4: "They do not direct their deeds toward turning to their God, for the spirit of harlotry is in their midst, and they do not know the LORD."

A nation and a people given over to sexual sins and abominations is governed by this spirit of harlotry. Nations and families are sold into spiritual bondage by the witchcraft of the spirit of harlotry. When we play around with sexual sin, we open ourselves to this demonic spirit. We must battle this principality that dominates our nation.

#### Symptom 10: Defeat, failure, and depression in the Christian life

Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 2:14, "Now thanks be to God who always leads us in triumph in Christ." Notice this verse is preceded by an exhortation from Paul to forgive others "lest Satan should take advantage of us; for we are not ignorant of his devices" (vv. 10-11). It is Satan's purpose to take advantage of our situations and to rob us of the victorious life that is ours in Christ. This symptom is often manifested by an inability to praise and worship. Psalm 92:1-4 is a testimony to the power of praise.

It culminates in verse 4, where David said, "For You, Lord, have made me glad through Your work; I will triumph in the works of Your hands." Again he said, "Save us, O Lord our God...to give thanks...[and] to triumph in Your praise" (Ps. 106:47).

#### Symptom 11: Occult involvement and behavior

Deuteronomy 18:9–12 catalogs the works of the occult and witchcraft, including child sacrifice; fortune-telling; soothsaying; interpreting omens; sorcery; and the work of those who conjure spells, mediums, spiritists, and those who call up the dead. Then verse 15 instructs the people to hear the word of God from the prophet of God and order their lives accordingly. Occult involvement is clearly a symptom of demonic control.

#### Symptom 12: Speech difficulties

In Matthew 9:32–33 Jesus rebuked a demon, and the mute man was able to speak. Speech difficulties may be physical, emotional, mental, and, in some cases, demonic. Extreme language and cursing may be prompted by the enemy.

#### Symptom 13: Doctrinal error

In 1 Timothy 4:1 we receive a warning that in the last days deceiving spirits will teach the doctrines of demons. Today religious cults and charlatans abound. The reason these deceivers draw many people is the power of the demonic that teaches them.

#### Symptom 14: Religious legalism

Galatians 3:1 says to the believer who is in danger of going back under the Law, "Who has bewitched you that you should not obey the truth?" The church at Galatia had forsaken a faith ministry that resulted in the miraculous (v. 5) for a law ministry of rules and regulations. Paul classified this error as witchcraft. Some deeply religious people are under the bondage of tradition, man-made rules, and outward appearances. Demons thrive in this kind of environment, especially demons of control. It is a lot easier to keep a ritual or list of rules than it is to walk by faith. Wherever there is any substitute for faith in the finished work of Christ, it is a doctrine of demons.\*

#### Light Under a Basket

<sup>21</sup><sup>a</sup>Also He said to them, "Is a lamp brought to be put under a basket or under a bed? Is it not to be set on a lampstand? <sup>22</sup><sup>a</sup>For there is nothing hidden which will not be revealed, nor has anything been kept secret but that it should come to light. <sup>23</sup><sup>a</sup>If anyone has ears to hear, let him hear."

<sup>24</sup>Then He said to them, "Take heed what you hear. <sup>a</sup>With the same measure you use, it will be measured to you; and to you who hear, more will be given. <sup>25a</sup>For whoever has, to him more will be given; but whoever does not have, even what he has will be taken away from him."

#### The Parable of the Growing Seed

<sup>26</sup>And He said, <sup>a</sup>"The kingdom of God is as if a man should 'scatter seed on the ground, <sup>27</sup>and should sleep by night and rise by day, and the seed should sprout and <sup>a</sup>grow, he himself does not know how. <sup>28</sup>For the

earth <sup>a</sup>yields crops by itself: first the blade, then the head, after that the full grain in the head. <sup>29</sup>But when the grain tipens, immediately <sup>a</sup>he puts in the sickle, because the harvest has come."

#### The Parable of the Mustard Seed

## BASICS Know Your Place in God's Plan

We all need to know our fellowship (part) in the plan of God. As individuals, churches, and families, we need to know what our role is in the plan of God. Prophets deal with eternal purposes. (See Ephesians 3:11.) The eternal plans and purposes ordained by the Lord from before the foundation of the world apply to every person. Each and every one of us has been born with a part in the eternal purposes of God. We can choose to walk in that purpose or reject it through disobedience and rebellion—or through ignorance.

We are not called to do anything and everything, but rather we are called to fulfill a specific function within the body of Christ. The saints need to be fitly joined together and every part functioning properly (Eph. 4:16). I believe that prophets are the primary ones who can help us find our places in the body and learn to function properly, thus fulfilling the will of the Lord for the church.\*

#### Jesus' Use of Parables

<sup>33a</sup>And with many such parables He spoke the word to them as they were able to hear *it.* <sup>34</sup>But without a parable He did not speak to them. And when they were alone, <sup>a</sup>He explained all things to His disciples.

#### Wind and Wave Obey Jesus

<sup>35</sup><sup>a</sup>On the same day, when evening had come, He said to them, "Let us cross over to the other side." <sup>36</sup>Now when they had left the multitude, they took Him along in the boat as He was. apart by him, and the shackles broken in pieces; neither could anyone tame him. <sup>5</sup>And always, night and day, he was in the mountains and in the tombs, crying out and cutting himself with stones.

<sup>6</sup>When he saw Jesus from afar, he ran and worshiped Him. <sup>7</sup>And he cried out with a loud voice and said, "What have I to do with You, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I <sup>8</sup>implore<sup>1</sup> You by God that You do not torment me."
