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What are “Adverbs”?

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An adverb is a word used to describe or modify a verb, an adjective or another adverb. They tell us how (in what manner), how much (in what degree), how far (to what extent), when (in what time), and where (in what place). In this book, you will study and learn useful English adverbs with their meanings.

Around 500 Useful Adverbs and their Meanings

English Adverbs -- A

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01 -- abaft -- in or behind the stern (back end) of a ship

02 -- aberrantly -- in a manner that is unusual or socially unacceptable; departing from an accepted standard [synonym: abnormally]

03 -- ably -- skillfully, successfully and well: [synonym: competently]

04 -- abominably -- in an extremely bad or unpleasant way, causing a strong feeling of dislike or disapproval [synonyms: appallingly, monstrously, repulsively]

05 -- abortively -- (of an action) in a manner that fails to produce the intended result [synonyms: fruitlessly, unproductively, unsuccessfully]

06 -- abruptly -- (a). in an unpleasantly manner that is sudden, rapid or unexpected [synonyms: hastily, suddenly, unexpectedly] | (b). (related to the way of talking) in an unfriendly manner

07 -- abstemiously -- in a sparing manner, avoiding too much in enjoyable activities such as eating food or drinking alcohol

08 -- abstractedly -- without paying attention to what is happening around you because you are thinking deeply about sth else; [synonyms: absentmindedly, inattentively, distractedly]

09 -- abstractly -- (a). in a manner that is based on general ideas or principals | (b). in a manner that exists in thought or as an idea, separated from physical reality (c). in a manner that does not represent somebody/something in a realistic way and expresses concepts only [synonyms: conceptually, intangibly, theoretically]

10 -- abstrusely -- in a manner that is complicated and difficult to understand especially when could be explained in an easier way [synonyms: perplexingly, puzzlingly]

11 -- acidly -- (of sb's remarks) in a manner that is critical, rude and unkind [synonym: sarcastically]

12 -- acquisitively -- in a manner that shows eagerness to own to acquire and own money or new possessions (material things) in a greedy way [synonyms: graspingly, covetously, materialistically]

13 -- acrimoniously -- (of an argument, a speech, discussion, behavior, etc.) in an angry manner or in a bitter, sharp, harsh manner of language or tone

14 -- adaptively -- in a manner that shows an ability to change when necessary in order to deal with different or changing situations

15 -- adeptly -- in a skillful way that shows natural ability or through proficiency [synonyms: adroitly, skillfully, proficiently]

16 -- adulterously -- relating to a physical relationship (intercourse) between a married person and sb who is not their spouse or partner [synonyms: disloyally, treacherously]

17 -- advantageously -- in a manner that is good, useful, helpful or favorable in a particular situation [synonyms: beneficially, constructively, gainfully]

18 -- adventitiously -- in a manner that is happening by chance or accident; in a manner that is not planned or designed

19 -- adventurously -- (a). in a way that includes new and interesting ideas, methods, things or experiences | (b). in a manner that is full of new, exciting or dangerous ideas, methods, things or experiences [synonyms: audaciously, boldly, daringly]

20 -- affectedly -- in an insincere, pretentious and unnatural way to impress other people

21 -- affectingly -- in a manner that produces strong feelings of distress, pity, regret, sorrow, or sympathy, etc.

22 -- agelessly -- in a manner that seems to be never coming to an end or growing old [synonyms: everlastingly, timelessly]

23 -- allusively -- in a manner that contains a word or phrase that makes a reference to a specific person, event, place, etc. in an indirect way

24 -- aloft -- high up in or into the air; far above the ground [synonym: overhead]

25 -- also -- (not used with negative verbs) in addition; as well; [synonyms: furthermore, too]

26 -- amateurishly -- in a manner that is done incompetently, inexpertly or unskillfully [synonyms: incompetently, unprofessionally]

27 -- ambidextrously -- (a). in a manner that seems to be able to use the right and left hands equally well | (b). (of a tool or instrument) in a manner that is designed to be used by right-handed and left-handed people with equal ease

28 -- ambiguously -- In a manner that can be understood or interpreted in more than one way [synonyms: dubiously, vaguely, puzzlingly]

29 -- ambitiously -- (a). with the intention of becoming extremely successful, rich, powerful, wealthy [synonym: determinedly] | (b). in a way that needs a lot of work, effort, money or time in order to achieve a specific goal because it involves too much of difficulty

30 -- amok -- without self-control

31 -- amorphously -- (a). in a manner that has no fixed, regular or distinct shape, design, form or structure [synonyms: formlessly, shapelessly,] | (b). in a way that has no definite character or nature | (c). in a manner that lacks organization [synonyms: unstructured, vaguely]

32 -- amphibiously -- (a). in a manner that is able to live/belong both on land and in water | (b). (of military operations) in a manner that involves soldiers landing or attacking at a place from the sea | (c). in a way that is suitable for use to operate on land or water; in a way that is able to operate on land or water

33 -- anciently -- long ago

34 -- androgynously -- in a manner that is partly male and partly female in appearance; having both male and female characteristics; of indeterminate gender [synonym: asexually]

35 -- anecdotally -- according to or by means of personal description or observations rather than proven facts

36 -- anew -- (a). again but in a new or different and more positive way | (b). once more [synonym: again]

37 -- anon -- soon or shortly

38 -- antagonistically -- In a manner that shows or feels dislike or opposition [synonym: hostility]

39 -- anthropocentrically -- In a manner that involves the belief of humans being the most significant or central entity of the universes

40 -- anthropomorphically -- In a manner that involves treatment of gods, animals or objects as if they have characteristics (in terms of appearance, behavior, etc.) of human beings

41 -- appallingly -- In an extremely bad way [synonyms: awfully, terribly] | (b). in a way that is extremely bad or poor

42 -- archly -- In an amusing manner because you are more aware of the situation than others

43 -- ardently -- in a way that shows strong emotion or feeling such as love, fondness, etc. for somebody/something [synonyms: enthusiastically, passionately]

44 -- aright -- correctly

45 -- artfully -- (a). in a manner that is clever or skillful but also cunning or dishonest | (b). (of things or actions) in a way that shows creative skill or taste

46 -- asymptotically -- (of a person or illness) in a manner that shows no symptoms

47 -- atmospherically -- (a). in a manner that relates to the mixture of gases that surrounds a place, earth, planet, star, etc. | (b). in a manner that creates an emotional or thrilling mood

48 -- atop -- on the top

49 -- audaciously -- In an extremely courageous, confident and often reckless or rude manner [synonyms: adventurously, daringly, boldly]

50 -- audibly -- in a way that can be heard [synonyms: noticeably, perceptibly]

51 -- augustly -- in a manner that is respected, dignified and impressive [synonyms: imposingly, majestically]

52 -- aurally -- with regard to sound or the ear

53 -- avidly -- with great interest, eagerness or enthusiasm.

54 -- avowedly -- in a manner that has been publicly admitted, declared, asserted or stated [synonym: confirmedly]

55 -- awesomely -- in a manner that is very impressive and often frightening [synonyms: amazingly, tremendously] | (b). in a manner that seems to be excellent or pleasurable

56 -- awful -- extremely or enormously

57 -- awfully -- extremely, terribly, very

58 -- awry -- In a position that is not normal and turned toward one side

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01 -- babyishly -- in a manner that is suitable for or typical of a baby or young child; like a baby [synonyms: childishly, immaturely]

02 -- back -- (a). behind you; opposite | (b). prevented from being coming out | (c). at a distance or direction farther away | (d). at a place or state that is previously left or asserted | (e). to or into the place, condition, situation or activity where sb/sth was before | (f). in return, reply or response | (g). in or into the past; before or ago

03 -- bad -- badly

04 -- badly -- (a). in a manner that is harmful, damaging or injurious | (b). in a manner that is morally unacceptable | (c). in a manner that is inappropriate or unsuitable in a particular situation | (d). in a manner that is of poor quality | (e). in a manner that is serious or severe | (h). in a manner that is full of problems [synonyms: dreadfully, ghastly, horribly, terribly]

05 -- balefully -- In a manner that seems to be threatening to do something wicked or harmful [synonyms: menacingly, malignantly, spitefully]

06 -- banally -- in a manner that is very boring and ordinary, containing nothing that is interesting, original, fresh, or important, etc. [synonym: tritely]

07 -- banefully -- in a manner that is wicked or causing harm

08 -- bang -- directly; exactly; completely

09 -- barefacedly -- in a manner that shows that you are not feeling ashamed of your bad behavior, or trying to hide sth bad that you have done, although other people think you should [synonyms: audaciously, blatantly, brazenly, impudently, shamelessly]

10 -- beneficently -- in a kind or helping manner [synonym: generously]

11 -- beneficially -- in a manner that has or produces a good result or helpful/useful effect [synonyms: advantageously, gainfully]

12 -- bestially -- in a manner that is characterized by extreme aggression, violence, and cruelty; in a manner that is like a large or dangerous animal: [synonyms: boorishly, degradingly, inhumanly, sordidly]

13 -- bewitchingly -- in a manner that is characterized by extreme beauty attraction or charm

14 -- big-headedly -- in a manner that is immodest or too proud, [synonym: egoistically]

15 -- big-heartedly -- in a very kind manner [synonyms: charitably, generously, philanthropically]

16 -- bigotedly -- in a manner that is characterized by determined, intolerant or unreasonable attachment or devotion to a particular belief, creed, race, religion, or faction, etc., and refusal to listen to or accept the opinions or views of anyone who disagrees [synonyms: intolerantly, dogmatically]

17 -- blasphemously -- (of behavior or language) in a manner that shows contempt or disrespect for God, deity, religion or holy/sacred objects [synonyms: irreverently, sacrilegiously]

18 -- blatantly -- (of actions that are considered bad) in a manner that appears to be open, shameless, shocking and obvious [synonym: flagrantly]

19 -- blithely -- (a). in a happy way; in a manner that shows that you are not worried | (b). in a manner that shows you do not care or are not anxious about what you are doing [synonyms: casually, unworriedly]

20 -- boastfully -- in a way that praises proudly about sth that you own or have done or have an ability to do [synonyms: arrogantly, braggingly]

21 -- bogusly -- in a manner that is pretending or intending to be real, genuine or true [synonym: falsely]

22 -- bookishly -- in a manner that shows you are too much interested in reading/studying and ignoring active or practical things; in a manner that involves mere book learning [synonyms: studiously, scholarly]

23 -- bossily -- In a manner that seems sb is trying to control other people by giving them orders or always telling them what to do while ignoring their feelings or opinions(domineeringly, dominantly, oppressively)

24 -- bouncingly -- in a manner that shows you are enjoying good health and full of energy [synonyms: animatedly, vigorously]

25 -- boyishly -- in an attractive way that seems to be looking or behaving like a boy

26 -- brashly -- (a). in a manner that seems to be loud, confident and aggressive [synonyms: impetuously] | (b). (of things and places) in a manner that seems to be unattractively too big, bright, colorful or noisy

27 -- brazenly -- (a). In a manner that seems to be made of, or the color of, brass (a metal made by mixing copper and zinc) | (b). In a manner that is open, immoral, shameful or shocking [synonyms: barefacedly, blatantly, brashly, shamelessly, unabashedly]

28 -- broadly -- (a). in a wide manner | (c). in a manner that is general; in a manner that is not detailed or thorough | (d). in a manner that includes different sorts of people or things | (e). (of land or water) in a manner that covers a wide area | (f). (of accent) in a manner that is easy to hear from which area they come | (g). (of a hint) in a manner that is very clear and easy to understand

29 -- brutally -- (a). in a very aggressive, violent and cruel manner [synonyms: atrociously, savagely, viciously] | (b). in a way that seems to

be direct and clear about sth unpleasant without thinking feelings of other people

30 -- brutishly -- in a manner that is rough, unkind, thoughtless, cruel and violent like a wild animal [synonyms: bestially, loutishly]

31 -- bullishly -- in a manner that shows that you are feeling confident and positive about the future [synonym: optimistically] | (b). in a manner that is relating to an increase in the share prices

32 -- bumptiously -- In a manner that shows you think you are very important with too much confidence and annoyance [synonyms: arrogant, boastfully, overbearingly]

33 -- bureaucratically -- In a manner that is connected with the system of extremely complicated and often unnecessary official rules and ways of doing things that a government or an organization has [synonyms: administratively, civically, governmentally, procedurally]

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01 -- cagily -- in a manner that shows you are unwilling to give information due to distrust or caution [synonyms: evasively, secretively, warily]

02 -- calamitously -- in a manner that causes great and often sudden damage to people's lives, property, etc. [synonyms: catastrophically, devastatingly, disastrously]

03 -- calculatingly -- in a manner that involves planning things in a very careful or clever way and ignoring other people's concerns so that you have an advantage and could achieve your goal [synonyms: manipulatively, shrewdly]

04 -- cannibalistically -- (a). in a manner that relates to the practice or behavior of eating the flesh of a human being by another human being | (b). in a manner that relates to the practice or behavior of eating the flesh of an animal by the member of its own species

05 -- cantankerously -- in a bad-tempered, uncooperative and always complaining manner [synonyms: crabbily, crankily, grouchily, grumpily]

06 -- capriciously -- in a way that shows a sudden, inexplicable, unexpected change in attitude, mood or behavior [synonyms: changeably, impulsively, whimsically]

07 -- captivatingly -- in a manner that takes all your attention; in a manner that is very attractive and interesting [synonyms: enchantingly, enthrallingly, mesmerizingly]

08 -- cartographically -- In a manner that relates to the art, science, process or practice of drafting, drawing or making maps

09 -- celestially -- in a manner that relates to the sky or visible heavens or to the universe beyond the earth's atmosphere such as sun, moon, stars

10 -- ceremoniously -- In a manner that involves a formal, serious or polite way of behaving or performing

11 -- chauvinistically -- In a way that seems to have an aggressive, unreasonable and enthusiastic belief that your own group, country, etc. is the best or most important

12 -- cheaply (a). in a manner that is obtainable at a low price or less price than expected [synonyms: economically, inexpensively] | (b). in a manner that is characterized by charging prices that are low | (c). in a manner that is unpleasant, distasteful, insincere, or unkind in an obvious way | (d). in a manner that is low in price and quality in comparison with similar items or services | (e). in a manner that has a low status, or of little worth because achieved in any immoral or illegal way without making any effort and therefore not deserving respect [synonym: contemptibly] | (f). in a manner that is characterized by trying to spend as little money as possible

15 -- chemotherapeutically -- In a manner that relates to the treatment of a disease, especially cancer by means of chemical substances that stop the growth of cancer cells

16 -- chicly -- in a very fashionable or stylish way [synonym: elegantly]

17 -- childishly -- (a). in a manner that is appropriate to, connected with, or typical of a child [synonym: babyishly] | (b). (of an adult) immaturely or irresponsibly

18 -- chillingly -- in a manner that makes you feel suddenly frightened, disturbed or worried, usually because of its association with sth cruel or violent [synonyms: frighteningly, terrifyingly, unnervingly]

33 -- collusively -- in a manner that Involves secret or illegal agreement that is designed to do sth that is bad, dishonest, evil, harmful, or illegal

34 -- commendably in a way that is worthy of praise and approval

35 -- commercially -- (a). in a manner that is connected with the activities of business, industry, and trade that include buying and selling of goods and services | (b). in a manner that seems to be more concerned with profitability and popularity instead of quality or value of things | (c). in a manner that involves making to gain a profit; in a manner that involves a plan or purpose to make a profit [synonyms: marketable, profitable] | (d). (of radio or television) in a way that is paid for by advertisements that are broadcast

44 -- conceitedly -- (a). in a manner that shows excessive pride in or high opinions of your abilities, achievements, or anything that you do | (b). in a manner that shows an artistic device or effect, that seems to be very clever or trying to be very clever but fails | (c). in a manner that shows a clever, ingenious, or fanciful expression in speech or writing involving a comparison between two things

45 -- concurrently -- at the same time [synonyms: overlapping, simultaneously]

46 -- condignly -- (of punishment) in a manner that is appropriate to the crime; in a manner that is deserved or fitting

47 -- connubially -- in a manner that is related to marriage or the relationship between husband and wife [synonyms: conjugally, matrimonially]

48 -- consanguineously -- in a manner that relates to or involves people of the same blood or origin, descended from the same ancestor

49 -- conscientiously -- In a manner that involves great care, attention [synonym: alertly]

50 -- consequentially -- In a manner that is of great importance or significance [synonym: inevitably]

51 -- considerably -- in a manner that is notably great in amount, distance, extent, importance, size, etc. [synonym: significantly]

52 -- considerately -- in a manner that shows concern about other people's feelings, wishes and needs; in a way that shows you are careful not to hurt others' feelings [synonyms: caringly, thoughtfully]

53 -- consistently -- (a). in a manner that is continuing for a period of time without any noticeable change [synonyms: constantly; steadily] | (b). in a manner that is in agreement with sth | (c). (a set of ideas) in a way that seems to have different parts that all are in agreement with each other | (d). in a fair and impartial way | (e). In every case or on

every occasion | (f). without changing in behavior; without changing in opinions, beliefs, attitude, standard; with no or very few exceptions [synonyms: unfailingly; invariably, usually]

54 -- constitutionally -- (a). in a manner that relates to the established set of principles of a nation, state, organization or group | (b). in a manner that is allowed or limited by the established set of principles of a nation, state, organization or group | (c). in a manner that relates to the ability of the body or mind to stay fit, healthy and strong

55 -- consummately -- in a way that shows great skill and natural ability to do sth; perfectly [synonym: skillfully]

56 -- contemporaneously -- in a way that is happening, originating, living or existing in the same period of time [synonyms: contemporarily, simultaneously]

57 -- contemptuously -- In a manner that involves extreme dislike, hatred or disapproval for sb/sth [synonyms: disdainfully, scornfully]

58 -- contrarily -- In a way that is intended to stubbornly do or say the opposite of what is generally expected and therefore irritating

59 -- contritely -- In a manner that shows you are Very sorry and ashamed about something wrong that you have said or done; [synonyms: penitently, remorsefully, repentantly, regretfully]

60 -- controversially -- in a manner that creates controversy or intense public disagreement

61 -- conveniently -- (a). in a manner that is fitting in or suitable for your purposes, needs, activities, plans, etc. without causing problem [synonyms: expediently, handily] | (b). in a manner that seems to be situated at a nearby or particular place that is easy to access to

62 -- conventionally -- (a). in a manner that is based on or in accordance with conduct, standards, etc that has been generally accepted, believed, or done in a society for a long time [synonyms:

traditionally; customarily] | (b). in a manner that involves tending to follow conduct, standards, etc that is generally accepted, believed or done in a society and seems to be boring

63 -- coolly -- (a). in a way that lacks, affection, friendliness or enthusiasm | (b). in a calm manner, without getting excited or angry [synonyms: composedly, serenely, unworriedly, unperturbedly]

64 -- coquettishly -- (of a woman) in a manner that involves behaving towards a man in a way that shows she finds him attractive but in fact has no intention to have a serious relationship with him
